

# BLANKET STATEMENTS FOR TRAVEL **MANAGEMENT**

# Dispersed Camping:

Motor vehicle use off of designated roads and trails for the purpose of dispersed camping is permitted on National Forest Lands for up to 150 feet from the centerline of the road or trail for the period 01/01 to 12/31.

# Seasonal Designations:

All routes with a seasonal designation are open from 04/16 to 12/31. Over-snow Vehicle:

A motor vehicle that is designed for use over snow

and that runs on a track or tracks and / or a ski or

### skis, while in use over snow. Adequate Snow:

Suffcient depth, density, and continuity of snow to prevent direct disturbance of ground cover when using an over-snow vehicle to travel cross-country. This definition recognizes that adequate snow conditions can be provided by a variety of conditions depending on factors such as current snow conditions, time of year, local climate, aspect, elevation, and vegetation types.

### **PURPOSE AND CONTENTS** Legend Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles

This Winter Use map shows the National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and the areas on National Forest System lands in the Fishlake National to 36 CFR 212.51. This map also identifies the vehicle seasonal restrictions that apply on those routes and in

by a particular class of vehicle under 36 CFR 212.51 should not be interpreted as encouraging or inviting use or implying that the road, trail, or area is passable, actively maintained, or safe for travel. Motor vehicle designations include parking along designated routes and at facilities associated with designated routes when it is safe to do so and when not causing damage to National Forest System resources. Seasonal weather conditions and natural events may render designated roads and trails impassable for extended periods. Designated areas may contain dangerous or impassable terrain. Many designated roads and trails may be passable only by high-clearance vehicles or four-wheel-drive vehicles. Maintenance of designated roads and trails will depend on available resources, and

and areas designated for the motor vehicle use under 36 CFR 212.51 for the purpose of enforcing the prohibition at 36 CFR 261.13. This is a limited purpose. The other public roads are shown for information and navigation purposes only and are not subject to designation under the Forest Service travel management regulation. It is the responsibility of the user to acquire the current MVUM.

These designations apply only to National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and areas

### **PROHIBITIONS**

on National Forest System lands on the Fishlake National Forest other than in accordance with these designations (CFR 261.13)

Violators of 36 CFR 261.13 are subject to a fine of up to \$5,000, imprisonment for up to 6 months, or both (18 U.S.C. 3571(e)). This prohibition applies regardless of the

snow uses, or other facilities and attractions on the Fishlake National Forest. Obtain forest visitor information from the local national forest office.

presence or absence of signs.

Designated roads, trails and areas may also be subject to temporary, emergency closures. As a visitor, you must comply with signs notifying you of such restrictions. A national forest may issue an order to close a road, trail or area on a temporary basis to protect the life, health, or safety of forest visitors or the natural or cultural resources in these areas. Such a temporary and/or emergency closures are consistent with the Travel Management Rule (36 CFR 212.52 (b), 36 CFR 261 subpart B).

The designation "road or trail open to all motor vehicles" does not supersede State traffic law.

# **OPERATOR**

Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles Only: These roads are open only to motor vehicles licensed under

Roads Open to All Vehicles: These roads are open to all motor vehicles, including smaller off-highway vehicles that may not be licensed for highway use (but not to oversize or overweight vehicles under State

State law for general operation on all public roads within the

Trails Open to All Vehicles:

These trails are open to all motor vehicles, including both highway legal and nonhighway legal vehicles.

Trails Open to Vehicles 50 inches or Less in Width: Trails open only to motor vehicles less than 50 inches in width at the widest point on the vehicle.

Special Vehicle Designation:

This symbol indicates the road or trail is open to classes of vehicles other than those listed above. Refer to the Seasonal

Seasonal Designation: This symbol, used in conjunction with one of the other road or trail symbols, indicates that the road or trail is open only during

certain portions of the year. Refer to Seasonal and Special Designation Table for further instructions. Other Public Roads and Trails:

—Highways, U.S., State Other Public Roads Other Public Trails These symbols are used to show routes the Forest Service does not have jurisdiction over and has not designated for

motorized use. These symbols are part of the reference layers

showing connections to towns and cities outside the forest

Short Route Identifier: This symbol is used for roads that are too short to show a symbol type on the map. The symbol contains the number of the road or trail. Users should refer to the corresponding

number in the Short Route Table for designation information. Seasonal Winter Closure:

Cross-country travel over snow by any motorized vehicle, including over-snow vehicles is prohibited between January 1 and April 15th. All vehicle classes consistent with road or trail use allowances are permitted on routes designated as Open Yearlong. No motorized use is permitted in Research Natural Areass. Travel by oversnow vehicles over adequate snow is permissible outside seasonal and all winter closure

areas. Fishlake, Mill Meadow, and Forsyth Reservoir may

be traversed by ATVs when the surface ice has sufficient

depth, density, and continuity to safely support winter use. All Winter Closure:

Cross-country travel over snow by any motorized vehicle is prohibited at all times. All vehicle classes consistent with road or trail use allowances are permitted on routes designated as Open Yearlong. No motorized use is permitted in Research Natural Areas. Travel by over-snow vehicles over adequate snow is permissible outside seasonal and all winter oversnow closure areas.
